

 Implementation of the School Resource Officer into the schools who actively engages with school officials, parents, students, and community based organizations to build positive relationships.

GONZALES POLICE DEPARTMENT SPECIAL INITIATIVES



-The Police Department collaborated with the Monterey County SPCA and provided rabies vaccinations and micro-chipping services.

-The Gonzales Police Department held a South County collaborative Community Police Academy (CPA) that was held concurrently with an additional CPA in South Monterey County.

-Gonzales Police Department has actively participated in the National Prescription Drug Take Back Day for several years. This bi-annual event has collected over 300 pounds of unwanted/expired prescription drugs in the past two years alone.

-National Night Out with the contribution of several community based organizations successfully held an impactful community event with over 1,000 attendees.

-On the night of Halloween, the Gonzales Police Officers Association hosted a Haunted House at the Police Department. Over 1,000 community members attended the event.

-Gonzales Police Department hosted Cocoa With a Cop event in an effort to strengthen community police relations on December. Over 200 community members attended this event.






Ulyses Fierros began his career with The Gonzales Police Explorers Program before being hired full time as a CSO. Ulyses aspires to be a Police Officer.
























