






2018 Call Locations







Grade B

Continue to pursue grant funding to replace our aging fire equipment and apparatus

We have been turned down grant funding for an engine 4 years in a row.

Our first out pumper is 12 years old and is beginning to experience breakdowns.

We have no reserve pumping apparatus.

Options: Purchase new/used or lease.

OES will provide us an engine to use but we have to be willing to commit the engine and 3 firefighters to any state incidents as needed.

We need a plan \$350k-\$450k
