
Did you meet at least one new person (student/community member/staff) during the event?








Who have you gone to when you needed help with your college application(s)? Select all that apply.



Key Takeaways

- Learning by doing.
 - Figuring out how to support my peers while dealing with and navigating the same questions and problems they were going through.
- There is a high demand for support and clarity around college.
 - Qualitative Data: No clarity around what "we're going to college for" (e.g. different types of degrees, programs, non-traditional pathways etc)
- We need more adults and champions to help keep this project going.
 - BFF grant can be renewed for 2 more years,
 - Community Action Grant can be applied to EVERY year.
 - It really is not a "money" problem, workshops are not expensive.
- Will be asking Gonzales Youth Council with support for the following years.
 - Willing to be a mentor and of support to whoever wants to lead this project next year.
