#### **DENNIS AND JANICE CAPRARA** COMMUNITY CENTER COMPLEX


The preliminary design for the Center has been finalized and we are moving into Construction documents. We will be breaking ground on Phase 1 of Center in April! The Capital Campaign, to date, has generated \$6.7 million and we have secured over \$18 million through grants and Measure X funding for the project.

Was approved for annexation this year. It's a 250,000 sq. ft. processing facility that replaces an existing one in Salinas. The company opted to move to Gonzales due to its central location in the Salinas Valley. ## TREATMENT PLANT SYSTEM EXPANSION



We are getting closer to the construction of the Wastewater System expansion. We are in the final steps to secure an State Revolving Fund Loan and plan to go out to bid for the project early next year and begin the work on the plant in the Spring.

## COMPUTER SERVER UPGRADE

The City recently replaced the network servers for the Police Station, City Hall and the Fire Station. Our systems were outdated, and the new systems promises to allow for more automation and efficiencies.

## GROWING OUR OWN

In an intentional effort to continue developing our own local talent we have hosted 3 interns. Two from CSUMB and 1 from UC Berkeley. We have also instituted an Officer Recruit position for our Police Department under the same model. This position will help us identify local talent interested in becoming a Police Officer and will allow us to invest in them while they develop into an official member of the Department.
